

Recommended for: Prevention Coordinators involved in the assessment, planning and organizing/implementing of evidence-based prevention interventions Dates: 7-11 December, 2016</p>	<p>TRACK 08 SPANISH ENGLISH PORTUGUESE</p>	<p>The nature, prevention and treatment of drug use disorders This training discusses a response to drug use disorders that is based on scientific evidence, human rights, and, above all, a scientific understanding of the nature of drug use and drug use disorders. . Recommended for: Policy makers involved in the planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of drug prevention, treatment and care responses to drug use and drug use disorders Dates: 8-10 December, 2016</p>
<p>TRACK 09 PORTUGUESE ENGLISH</p>	<p>Civil Society Engagement of Media Participants will learn the basic, fundamental concepts related to substance abuse prevention and the engagement of the media to advance policy changes by engaging civil society and the media to influence stakeholder and decision makers in policy-relevant solutions to substance abuse related issues. Recommended for: This session is designed for existing networks (eg: Amore Exigente) and NGO's based in Brazil Dates: 8 -10 December, 2016</p>	<p>TRACK 10 SPANISH ENGLISH PORTUGUESE</p>	<p>Guidelines for identification and management of substance use and substance use disorders in pregnancy These guidelines contain recommendations on the identification and management of substance use and substance use disorders for health care services which assist women who are pregnant, or have recently had a child, and who use alcohol or drugs or who have a substance use disorder. Recommended for: Medical Practitioners working with in obstetric services and specialist services Dates: 8-10 December, 2016</p>
<p>TRACK 11 SPANISH ENGLISH PORTUGUESE</p>	<p>International Consortium of Universities for Drug Demand Reduction (ICUDDR) The consortium aims to promote addiction science as a multidisciplinary field and encourage universities to develop addiction studies programs while integrating the UTC and UPC as primary academic resources. Member universities will collect training data on students for purposes of research, evaluation, and identification of best practices through the ISSUP website; and develop international academic exchange programs with faculty, students, interns and fellows. Recommended for: University deans together with academic curriculum developers Dates: 8-9 December, 2016</p>
