Eligibility Criteria for ICCE Examinations

Eligibility Criteria for the ICCE Credentials

i) International Certified Addiction Professional I (ICAP I):

- a. At least 1 year of full time or 1500 hours of supervised working experience in drug and alcohol related field. Passed the first public examination.
- b. Written verification of competency in required counselling skills and functions as certified by counsellors, supervisors or other health care professionals who have personally observed the candidate's alcohol and/or drug abuse related counselling work.
- c. Documentation of a total of 120 contact hours of education and training in alcoholism and drug abuse or related counselling subjects. Included in this total must be at least 6 contact hours of HIV/AIDS training and at least 6 contact hours of ethics training.
- d. Submission of a signed and dated statement that the candidate has read the ICCE Commission's Code of Ethics for counsellors and has agreed to adhere to it.
- e. Completion of an application for the appropriate level of credential and submission of the same to ICCE
- f. Payment of **non-refundable** application fee.

ii) International Certified Addiction Professional II (ICAP II):

- a. At least 2 years of full-time or 3,000 hours of supervised working experience as an alcoholism and / or drug abuse related counsellor. The 2 years need not be consecutive.
- b. Successful completion of ICAP I and practising as an addiction counsellor for at least 2 years following ICAP I certification or graduate / higher in relevant field.
- c. Written verification of required counselling skills and functions as certified by counsellors or supervisors or health care professionals who have personally observed the candidate's alcohol and/ or drug abuse counselling work.
- d. Documentation of a total of 240 contact hours of education and training in alcoholism and drug abuse or related counselling subjects. Included in this total must be at least 6 contact hours of HIV/AIDS training and at least 6 contact hours of ethics training.
- e. Submission of a signed and dated statement that the candidate has read the ICCE Commission's Code of Ethics for counsellors and has agreed to adhere to it.
- f. Completion of an application for the appropriate level of credential and submission of the same to the ICCE.
- g. Payment of **non-refundable** application fee.
- h. Passing of the ICAP I examination.

iii) International Certified Addiction Professional III (ICAP III)

- a. At Least 5 years of full-time or 7500 hours of supervised working experience as an alcoholism and/or drug abuse related counsellor.
- b. Successful completion of ICAP II and practicing as an addiction counsellor for at least 2 years following ICAP II or Masters / higher in relevant field.
- c. Written verification of competency in required counselling skills and functions as certified by counsellors or supervisors or other health care professionals who have personally observed the candidate's alcohol and/or drug abuse counselling work.
- d. Documentation total of 500 contact hours of education and training in alcoholism and drug abuse or related counselling subjects. Included in this total must be at least 6 contact hours of HIV/AIDS training and at least 6 contact hours of ethics training.
- e. Submission of a signed and dated statement that the candidate has read the ICCE Certification Code of Ethics and agreed to adhere to it.
- f. Completion of an application for the appropriate level of credential and submission of the same to ICCE.
- g. Payment of **non-refundable** application fee.
- h. Passing of the ICAP II examination.

The eligibility criteria for RC credentialing

A. Experience

- 1. One year of supervised experience in the area of Substance Use Disorders
- 2. Evidence of two continued years of total abstinence from all kind of substances.
- 3. Evidence of 100 hours of education/training in SUD/Peer Recovery

B. Recommended practice areas:

- 1. Screening
- 2. Outreach during Pre and Post Treatment
- 3. Facilitating Referral
- 4. Continuing care (Conducting Home visit, facilitating support group, Psycho-education, providing support in case management)
- 5. Community education (preparation & delivery under direct supervision)

C. Recommended training/education hours

- 1. 100 hours addiction specific training/education which should include ICCE Basic UTC 1 and 2, Specialized Recovery Course, 6 hours of Ethics and 6 hours of HIV.
- 2. The other courses which may be relevant are:
 - Documentation Community/family education
 - Communication and facilitation skills.
 - Screening methodology Identification of co-occurring disorders
 - Service coordination
 - Referral
 - Self Care and avoiding burnout
 - Recovery/Relapse planning
 - HIV/AIDS training
 - Cultural Awareness training
 - Pharmacology and Science of Addiction
