### **MEM – Characteristics**






- Governmental and objective process
- Based on transparency, impartiality, and equality
- Constructive process without sanctions
- Evaluation rounds
- Unique evaluation process
- All evaluations are conducted in a collective manner by all MS
- All MS evaluate and are evaluated
- No country participates in its own evaluation
- Constantly improving with time

### **Demand Reduction PoA (5)**

- Establish demand reduction policies with a public health focus that are evidencebased, multidisciplinary, multisectoral and respectful of human rights, considering the guidelines and/or recommendations of specialized international organizations.
- Establish and/or strengthen an integrated system of universal, selected and indicated prevention programs on drug use, giving priority to vulnerable and atrisk populations, evidence-based and incorporating a human rights, gender, age and multicultural approach.
- Establish and strengthen, as appropriate, a national treatment, rehabilitation and social reintegration system for people with problematic drug use, including a human rights and gender-based approach, taking into account internationally accepted quality standards.
- Foster ongoing training and certification of human resources that provide prevention, treatment, rehabilitation and social reintegration services.
- Establish and/or strengthen governmental institutional capacities to regulate, enable, accredit and supervise prevention programs and, care and treatment services.
