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DERECH- ARIELA: MULTI-DISCIPLINARY CENTER

- Detox. Ward-for 1 month
- Therapeutic Community (TC)- for 9 months
- Transitional living home (Half-way-house)- for 6 months
- Ambulatory (outpatient) Unit

• Only for women in addiction



THERAPEUTIC COMMUNITY

 "a drug-free environment in which people with addictive problems live together in an organized and structured way to promote change toward a drug-free life in the outside society" (Broekaert, Kooyman & Oenberg, 1998, p. 95)

• "Only you can do that, but you can't do it alone".



THE ESSENCE OF A THERAPEUTIC ENVIRONMENT-5 UNIVERSAL QUALITIES

- Attachment: A culture (sense) of belonging.
- Containment: A culture of safety.
- Communication: A culture of openness & honesty.
- Involvement & Inclusion: A culture of participation & responsibility.
- Agency: A culture of empowerment.



THE PLAN

- The residents develop sound living habits and participate in an intensive program of individual and group therapy (12 steps group, behavioral groups, emotional groups etc.); that equip them to succeed upon re-entry into their home community.
- They also receive medical treatment (including a psychiatrist).
- There are also extramural activities which include trips, sport, art, drama, movement etc.
- We also use family intervention, seminars, workshops and lectures to empower the change.

WHY EQUAL?

• The starting point in "Derech Ariela": A human being is a human being wherever he or she is.



WHY DIFFERENT?

- The main difference: The damage of the relation space & its consequences on the women life.
- The difference is not only from men; but also, between woman to woman.



THE MAIN CONSEQUENCES

- Multi-symptoms: Addiction, BPD, Eating Disorder, Suicidality, Prostitution
 Self-destruction behaviors.
- Physical pain: Like stomachache, menstrual cramp, headache etc.
- Mental changes: Dissociation disorders, Depression & Anxiety disorders.
- Emotional changes: Variable mood, emotional detachment, lack of stable emotional state, sense of loneliness.
- **Cognitive changes:** Distortion of thinking (good or bad), dichotomous & stubborn thinking (black & white), lack of flexibility thinking.



THE MAIN CONSEQUENCES

- Pathological changes in interpersonal relationship: Lack of trust, themes of control & power, dependencies & exploitation, hacked borders, see herself as an object (objectification).
- Pathological changes in the identity: Low self-image, sense of self-inability/incapability, low self-confidence.
- Spiritual changes: Low faith and hope, lack of the ability to ask for help.
- Revictimizing: Lack of the ability to recognize dangerous situations.



THREE UNIQUE PRINCIPLE

- Relation
- Thinking outside the box
- Continuity of Treatment



RELATION

• Early damage in the relation space:

- Lack of trust
- Low self-image
- Low self-confidence
- Low self-esteem
- Sense of self inability/incapability
- Sense of emptiness
- Sense of lack of importance
- The "nothingness" is always in the background





"We were born in relation We damaged in relation And we recover in relation" (Hendrix)



IMPLEMENTATION

- An equal relation (face to face connection): Less relation based on authority & hierarchy.
- The choice principle: The choice is in your hands; You know best what's right for you; We always ask- what can help you now?
- The meaning principle: For example, by rituals when the women go through a phase; Give the women responsibility & independence.
- Increase the margin of error: Accepting mistakes & learning from them.



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THINKING OUTSIDE

THE BOX

- Matching treatment to the individual/group:
- **Personal suit for each woman:** Build an individual treatment program based on the specific woman's needs.
- Group suit: Group interventions based on the "here & now" situation; "No grocery list".
- Strengthening the individual means strengthening the group and vice versa, again and again and again.
