What is the most harmful drug?

DIFFERENT MEASURES OF HARM
Share of countries reporting the drug as most harmful

- Drug use disorders: Cannabis (42%), Opioids (18%), Cocaine (12%), Amphetamine-type stimulants (10%), Other drugs (18%)
- Drug-related deaths: Cannabis (12%), Opioids (45%), Cocaine (15%), Amphetamine-type stimulants (10%), Other drugs (16%)
- Drug-related treatment: Cannabis (15%), Opioids (35%), Cocaine (10%), Amphetamine-type stimulants (10%), Other drugs (30%)

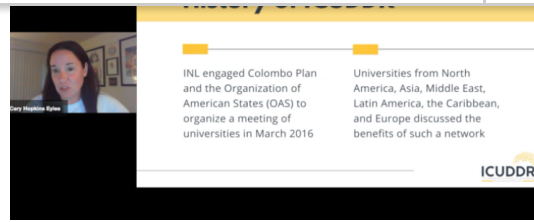
