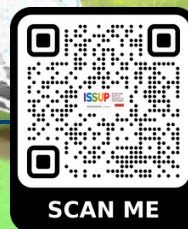

# Getting Ready for ISSUP Conference 2025

## Weather & What to Bring

Bali's tropical climate calls for thoughtful preparation to ensure a comfortable visit. During the dry season, from April to October, the warm temperatures and abundant sunshine make it essential to bring sunblock to protect your skin from UV exposure. Lightweight, breathable clothing and a hat are also recommended to stay cool while exploring. Even in the rainy season, from November to March, the island's humidity can feel intense, so staying hydrated and dressing for the heat remains important. Packing these essentials will help you make the most of your time on the island. The temperature average in September is 29°C.

# Visa

## Travel Visas

Visitors to Indonesia may require a visa depending on their nationality. Please review the following information to ensure you have the appropriate visa for attending the ISSUP event 2025 in Indonesia:

### General Visa Information:

### Visa on Arrival (VoA) / Electronic Visa on Arrival (eVoA):

### Free Visa Entry:

Certain countries are eligible for visa-free short visits. Please check if your country is on the list here: [List Free Visa Countries](#)

### Regular Visa Application:

If your country is not eligible for Free Visa or VoA/eVoA, you must apply for a visa through the nearest Indonesian Embassy or Consulate in your country.

### Calling Visa Requirements:

Nationals of specific countries must apply for a "Calling Visa" prior to travel. Please refer to the list and application details here: [List of Calling Visa Countries](#)

It is recommended to check visa requirements well in advance and ensure your passport is valid for at least six months from the date of entry. We strongly recommend checking your visa eligibility and completing any necessary applications well in advance of your travel date.

# ALL Indonesia – Arrival Card Service

## New Entry System for International Arrivals

The Government of Indonesia has officially launched All Indonesia, an integrated digital system that streamlines passenger arrival declarations for immigration, customs, health, and quarantine into a single platform—replacing multiple forms previously required.

### Key features of All Indonesia include:

- The form can be completed online via the official website [allindonesia.imigrasi.go.id](https://allindonesia.imigrasi.go.id)
- mobile app (available on **Appstore** and **Playstore**) starting up to three (3) days before arrival

**Completion takes approximately 2.5 minutes.** ([application tutorial video](#))

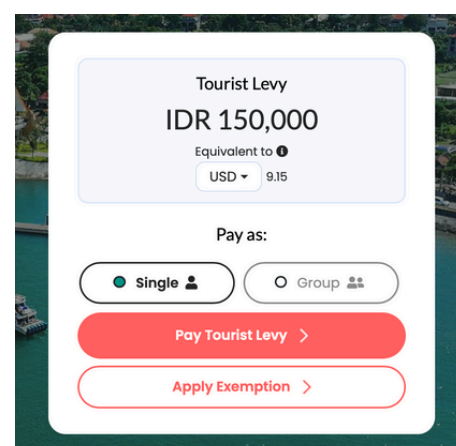
Once submitted, travelers receive a QR code to present upon arrival in Indonesia. The system is free of charge.

Beginning September 1, 2025, the system becomes mandatory at major airports—Soekarno-Hatta (Jakarta), Ngurah Rai (Bali), and Juanda (Surabaya)—and will be expanded to all international entry points by October 1, 2025



## Bali Tourist Levy

All international visitors to Bali are required to pay a tourist levy—IDR 150,000 (approx. USD 10–14)—as part of Regulation No. 6 of 2023. This levy supports the preservation of Bali's cultural heritage and natural environment. You may pay online before your trip via the official **Love Bali** platform.

### UPC 81: Engaging Youth in Prevention Curriculum

(4 days, 15th - 18th September 2025)

Location: The Dome, Discovery Kartika Plaza Hotel

Language: English with translation to Bahasa.

#### Overview:

This course provides youth with basic knowledge of substance use disorders and the science of prevention, and trains them to become effective youth leaders in substance use prevention programs in their communities. The training is designed to help youth understand and recognize the important role they play in building and sustaining prevention efforts, as well as in developing and implementing prevention interventions and policies effectively in their communities, colleges, and workplaces. The training places teamwork at the core of the program through an experiential learning process that supports youth development by incorporating cultural values into substance use prevention, while providing space for youth leadership practice.







## **Universal Nursing Addictions Curriculum (UNAC)**

3 days (16th – 18th September 2025)

Location: Discovery Room, Discovery Kartika Plaza Hotel

Language: English

### **Overview:**

This course helps nurses build knowledge, skills, and engagement in caring for individuals, families, and communities affected by substance use disorders. It offers a balanced approach, combining the science and art of nursing care for those impacted by problematic substance use.

## **Universal Recovery Curriculum (URC) 2: Delivering Recovery Support Services: The Recovery ALLIES (Allies Link and Lend Inventive Engaging Support) Model**

4 days (15th – 18th September 2025)

Language: English with translation to Bahasa

### **Overview:**

The URC-ALLIES course equips participants with core competencies to work as recovery support professionals. It covers substance use disorders, recovery principles, trauma-informed care, self-care, and boundary setting. Designed as a standalone course with no prerequisites, it enables rapid training for the field.

## **Managing SUD Treatment Services in line with International ‘Key Quality Standards’ (the Management Handbook, 2025)**

2 days (16th – 17th September 2025)

### **Overview**

This course is for managers and clinical leads of SUD treatment services. While international organizations have developed evidence-based standards such as the WHO/UNODC International Standards for the Treatment of Drug Use Disorders (2020), there is limited practical guidance on implementation. To address this gap, the International Consortium on Quality (ICQ) created the Management Handbook to support funders, leaders, and managers in putting these standards into practice.
