



Sarawak's Social Challenges

Property Crimes

Crimes related to theft and damage, often driven by addiction

Divorce

Legal dissolution of marriages, sometimes linked to substance-related issues

Teenage Pregnancy

Pregnancies among young individuals, potentially linked to substance use

Sexual Crimes

Crimes involving sexual assault, sometimes linked to substance use

Online Gambling

Addictive gambling activities conducted online

Dysfunctional Families

Families with strained relationships and communication issues



Domestic Violence

Violent acts within family settings, exacerbated by substance abuse

STIs

Sexually transmitted infections, often associated with risky behaviors

Mental Health

Psychological well-being, often affected by substance abuse

Poverty

Economic hardship, often exacerbated by substance abuse

Homelessness

Lack of stable housing, often linked to substance abuse

78% Peer influence

64% Family dysfunction

59% Unemployment and poverty

Alcohol and methamphetamine use was normalized and widespread.




Implementing the Sarawak OSC Model

Collaborate with Organizations

Partner with various organizations at different levels to enhance effectiveness.

Decentralize Activities

Implement five pillars of prevention, enforcement, treatment, rehabilitation, and reintegration.



Engage Community Leaders

Work with community leaders to reduce stigma and promote help-seeking.

Integrate Approaches

Coordinate efforts to reduce drug supply and demand while integrating SUD interventions.

Establish OSC

Form a multi-agency committee to address drug issues.








Help-Seeking Behavior










Sarawak's Integrated Treatment and Recovery Cycle
