




DRUG SITUATION IN INDONESIA

The prevalence rate of drug abusers in 2023 has decreased compared to 2021, but the number of drug abusers is still relatively high reaching 3.33 million people.

Respondents age range 15 years old to 64 years old Age group that tend to be an abuser is the productive age group 15-49 years.



INDONESIA **DEMOGRAPHIC** BONUS

- The demographic bonus in Indonesia refers to a period when the productive age population (15-64 years old) significantly outnumbers the non-productive population (children and elderly).




SOFT SKILL TRAINING PROGRAM
