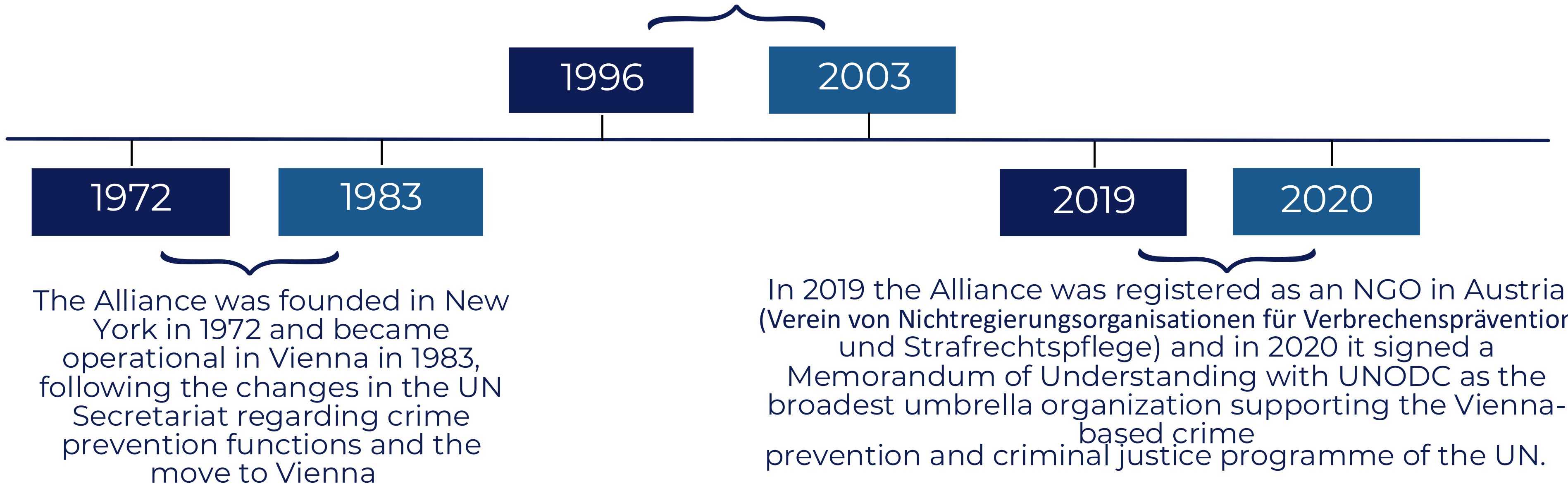

History



It worked closely with the UN Crime Prevention Branch (until 1996), then Division (1996-97), subsequently the Centre for International Crime Prevention (CICP, 1997-2003), and finally the UN Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), which was established in 2003.

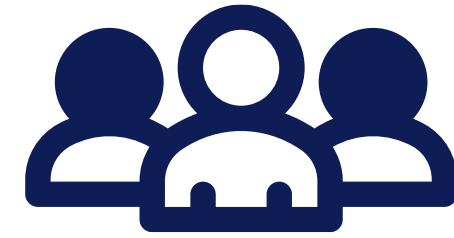
Our scope is the broad mandate of the UN crime prevention and criminal justice programme, including:

- Within the framework of Agenda 2030 we connect to other relevant processes (for example the High Level Political Forum – HLPF)

civil society – UN nexus.

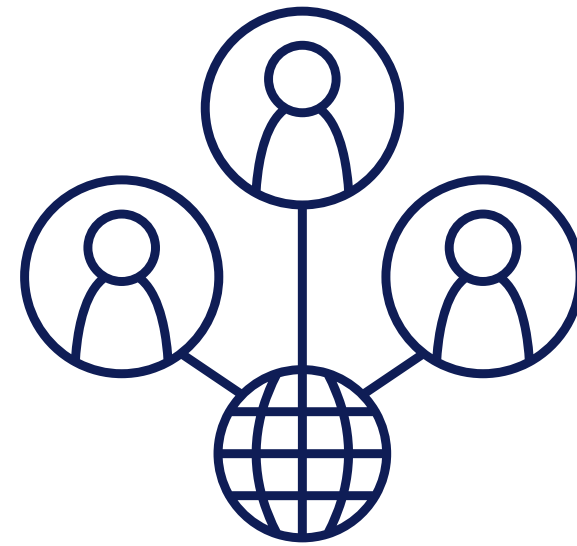

- The **Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice (CCPCJ)** functions as a governing body of the UNODC, along with the **Commission on Narcotic Drugs**.
- The CCPCJ coordinates with other United Nations bodies that have specific mandates in the areas of crime prevention and criminal justice, and is also the preparatory body to the United Nations Crime Congress.
- In other words, the Crime Commission acts as the principal policy-making body of the United Nations in the field of crime prevention and criminal justice.
